A FESTIVAL OF JAZZ

Celebrating Women's Suffrage

Women are to the forefront of our festival of jazz here in Martinborough in 2018.

The popular four-day music event held over the first weekend of Spring features three headline acts: Wellington jazz vocalist Mary Watson leading festival favourites Noir, the dynamic and energetic Miho Wada with her Jazz Orchestra, and New Zealand jazz legend and festival patron Rodger Fox.

"We set out to celebrate the 125th Anniversary of Women's Suffrage in New Zealand," says festival Music Director Lee Quayle. "Two of our ticketed events are led by

women, and Erna Ferry features strongly as part of Rodger Fox's FunkBone Experience. Rodger is also bringing the talented Lauren Ellis on drums and Eilish Wilson on saxophone."

The headline events will take place at the Village Cafe. Dinner reservations should be made separately from buying tickets for these events.

Elsewhere throughout the festival weekend we'll see the return of a number of old favourites and the introduction of some new faces and sounds. These gigs will be at a variety of venues and will be free to all customers.

"I'm really happy to have a solid core of quality performers returning to the festival," says Lee. "Stephanie Bishop and Chris Yeabsley will play Pinocchio again this year.

They are a special favourite of mine, and their unique vocal-organ performance is always worth listening to. And Gypsy Swing (Sam Cooke and Leigh Jackson) are returning for our annual superb fix of gypsy jazz in homage to Django Reinhardt".

New acts this year include the star-studded Kahutara Municipal Brass Band and a NZ Jazz School group currently going under the moniker of Intuition. Multi-instrumentalist Kate Marshall will be returning with fantastic guitarist Bob Cooper-Grundy; but she has also put together the all-female Raven's Trio, with "Queen of the Boogie Piano" Cindy Muggeridge and the drummer with the 'solid feel', Anje Glindemann. They will be bringing their "highly engaging combination of the talents" to the main stage on Friday at lunchtime.

The opening night of the festival features the stylish Mary Watson and Noir, a sultry blend of cool jazz and mellow mood music.

In her 6th year at the Jazz in Martinborough festival, Mary Watson has a new and accomplished line up to support her intimate and inclusive stage presence.

Wellington drummer Greg Crayford, local bassist, Patrick Bleakley and Wellington pianist and singer Ruth Armishaw, combine their many years' experience to create a sophisticated musical environment to help draw listeners into a connection with her refined singing style and honest interpretations of the music.

Noir have drawn big crowds to Peppers Parea during previous festivals and last year's gig was a highlight for many.

"We thought it was time to showcase Mary's singing talents for a wider festival audience," says Lee Quayle (JIM Music Director) "Mary has a great band of super musicians who play a wide range of jazz with ease and style."

Are you experienced? Get a little of New Zealand trombonist Rodger Fox and The FunkBone Experience in this jazz funk blues-drenched band and you won't have to wonder.

Fronted by Rodger Fox – trombonist – arranger – Jazz in Martinborough Patron, band leader and bona fide musical legend, The FunkBone Experience wields smoky licks, classic funk, down-home blues and remakes of classic jazz standards with a repertoire reading likes the who's who of the funk jazz era.

Material by artists such as Herbie Hancock, Etta James, Maceo Parker, The Jazz Crusaders, Tom Scott, Raul De Souza, Jimmy McGriff and other great groove masters.

In tune with this year's theme of Women in Jazz, the FunkBone Experience featuring Erna Ferry will also include two other talented female artists, Eilish Wilson (saxophone) and Lauren Ellis (drums), alongside Nick Granville (guitar) and Rory Macartney (bass).

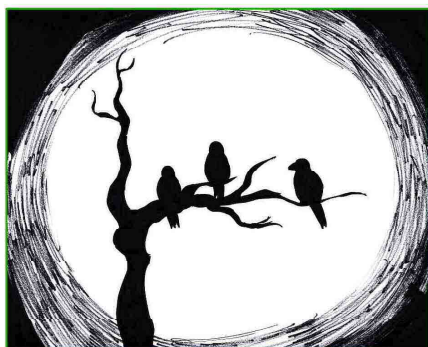

"I'm really looking forward to hearing these talented musicians play," says Jazz in Martinborough Music Director Lee Quayle. "When you're putting together a programme for the festival, you look for variety, quality and interest and when Kate suggested this combo I was very happy to put them on the main stage," says Lee. This will be a Friday highlight for me, he adds.

The Raven's Trio is the highly engaging combination of the talents of the "Queen of the Boogie Piano" Cindy Muggeridge on vocals and keys, Kate Marshall on almost any other instrument that can be bowed, plucked, blown or squeezed – and she sings! – and Anje Glindemann holding the groove on the

drums, while offering her own vocal contributions.



Cindy Muggeridge has developed a unique style that draws on the great pianists of the blues, the classic women blues singers, a taste of the American songbook, and a freshness of approach heard in her own original songs, that tell their stories with a mixture of humour, poignancy and insight. Her duo, Raven Mavens, is a favourite at folk gigs and festivals,

and now the Raven's Trio offers another opportunity to hear her captivating musical personality in a fresh musical setting.

Multi-instrumentalist Kate Marshall plays accordion, flute and violin – and also sings. She started her musical life as a classically trained pianist, but had an occasionally misguided tendency to improvise the ends of Mozart sonatas. She decided that she should find some music where that wasn't going to break the rules, and so has found a musical home playing a scintillating range of blues, cajun, Irish and jazz. She is usually found as part of the duo *Bob and Kate* or with the country combo *Hard Candy*.

Anje Glindemann plays drums and has a style that is always a key part of the group sound, – sometimes light, sometimes swinging, but always with a solid feel. Anje has the philosophy of playing the 'song' and not just the 'drums' (while actually playing the drums – and singing!). She has her own band, 'The Salty Hearts', sits in with loads of others, including Andrew London, and loves to play with the Ravens wherever possible.

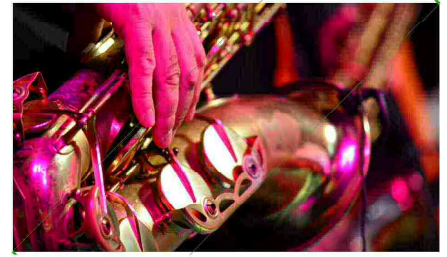

Since making their debut at the 2017 Martinborough Jazz Festival, the band have completed a residency at Micro Winebar, performed at events such as the Clareville and Masterton A & P Shows, and played several gigs at this year's Wellington Jazz Festival.

Courtney Naera Courtney is a popular Carterton singer, who keeps busy playing in bars and restaurants locally, and throughout the Lower North Island. She teaches in several Wairarapa schools, and is a former UCOL music tutor.

Alex Nyman Before playing on five seasons of *Dancing With The Stars NZ*, Alex shared the stage with pop icons such as Chaka Khan and Frank Sinatra. These days he lives in Greytown and teaches saxophone at the New Zealand School of Music.

Saali Marks A graduate of the NZSM, Saali is currently Head of Music at Kuranui College. He leads his own band *Battle Ska Galactica* who perform regularly around the country.

Pat Bleakley A regular on the Wellington scene, Pat is based in Featherston and is



perhaps best known for his ongoing work with well-known drummer John Rae's group, *The Troubles*.

Guitarist Alexander Boulton is currently studying Jazz Performance in the honours program at The New Zealand School Of Music. His primary sources of inspiration are the players from the bebop era of jazz (Bud Powell, Charlie Parker, Fats Navarro etc.).

Alex performs regularly around Wellington in various contexts ranging from solo and duo gigs to big band playing, and is consistently writing original music, inspired by times and people; past and present.

Stephanie's smoky vocals are a perfect foil for their extensive repertoire based on all of your favourites from the great song books. Think Gershwin to Cole Porter to Aretha Franklin presented in a new way – this is a performance not to be missed!

Stephanie Bishop is a jazz, blues and soul singer who has performed both nationally and



in the UK. Her singing began over 14 years ago, during her university years, when she performed on a fortnightly basis at the Hamilton Sohl wild food bar and restaurant. Following this, Stephanie


performed with jazz and blues duos and quartets throughout the North Island. When living in the Hawke's Bay, Stephanie and her band, *Rothko*, performed frequently at local restaurants, wineries, bars and the Hastings Opera House. She performed at both public and private events such as weddings, the WETA Wine and food festival, the Art Deco festival and for the Napier Jazz club; which included opening for Nathan Haines at the Church Road Jazz in the Park to an audience of approximately 4000. When Stephanie left the Hawke's Bay she travelled to London where she performed in the legendary "Spice of Life" club in Soho and with a London-based Big Band.
